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Important Safety Instructions

1. Read these instructions.
2. Keep these instructions.
3. Heed all warnings.
4. Follow all instructions.
5. Do not use this apparatus near water.
6. Clean only with dry cloth.
7. Do not block any ventilation openings. Install in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.
8. Do not install near any heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves, or other apparatus (including other amplifiers) that produce heat.
9. Use the apparatus only in Moderate climates (not in tropical climates).
10. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized or grounding type plug. A polarized plug has two blades with one wider than the other, a grounding type plug has two blades and a third grounding prong, the wide blade or the third grounding prong are provided for your safety. If the provided plug does not fit onto your outlet, consult an electrician for replacement of the obsolete outlet.
11. Protect the power cord from being walked on or pinched particularly at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the apparatus.
12. Only use attachments / accessories specified by the manufacturer.
13. Unplug this apparatus during lightning storms or when unused for long periods of time.
14. If you install the apparatus in a built-in installation, such as a bookcase or rack, ensure that there is adequate ventilation. Leave 20cm (8") of free space at the top and sides and 10cm (4") at the rear. The rear edge of the shelf or board above the apparatus shall be set 10cm (4") away from the rear panel or wall, creating a flue like gap for warm air to escape. Good airflow is necessary to help ensure proper operation. Not only should you

provide enough free space around the unit, but also ensure that air can flow freely and escape from the amplifier surroundings. Failure to do so may cause thermal shutdown of the unit, and reduced life expectancy.

15. Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel. Servicing is required when the apparatus has been damaged in any way, such as:
 - a. When the power supply cord or plug is damaged.
 - b. If liquid has been spilled, or objects have fallen into the apparatus.
 - c. If the apparatus has been exposed to rain or water.
 - d. If the apparatus has been dropped or damaged in any way.
 - e. If the apparatus does not operate normally by following the instructions. Adjust only those controls that are covered by the operating instructions.
 - f. When the apparatus exhibits distinct change in performance this indicates a need for a service.

1. AC Fuse

The AC fuse inside the unit is not user-serviceable. If you cannot turn on the unit, contact the dealer from whom you purchased this unit.

2. Care

Occasionally you should dust the unit all over with a soft cloth. For stubborn stains, use a soft cloth dampened with a weak solution of mild detergent and water. Dry the unit immediately afterwards with a clean cloth. Don't use abrasive cloths, thinners, alcohol, or other chemical solvents, because they may damage the finish or remove the panel lettering.

3. POWER WARNING: Before plugging in this device for the first time, read the following section carefully.

AC outlet voltages vary from country to country. Make sure that the voltage in your area meets the voltage requirements printed on the unit's rear panel. e.g. ~ 110V / 240V, 50/60HZ. The power cord is used to disconnect this unit from the AC power source. Make sure that the plug is readily operable (easily accessible) at all times. If you do not intend to use the unit for an extended period, remove the power cord from the AC outlet.

4. Earth

The unit is defined as Class1 in EN60065 (low voltage directive) and MUST BE EARTHED. Connect only to a mains socket outlet with protective earth, and only use the power cord supplied.

Get to Know the MMS

Overview

The MMS product line offers state-of-the-art, high resolution audio with the convenience of accessing all local audio content and streaming Internet services with a single device.

Multiple independent streams of audio (five on the MMS-5e, or three on the MMS-3e, and 2 on the MMS-1e) can be played using analog, digital, or pristine jitter-free high definition USB audio for audiophile DACs and high-end amplifiers that have digital USB inputs.

The MMS has one video output that can be configured to display Now Playing information for any of the audio outputs.

MMS Capabilities

- Control of multiple discreet audio channels throughout the home.
- Play back of audiophile grade uncompressed, lossless 24-bit/192kHz audio files through analog, digital coax or USB outputs.
- Browse music and control playback from around the home using any iOS or Android device, web browser, or control system including Crestron, AMX, Control4, RTI, URC, Savant, ELAN, Command Fusion and BitWise.
- Access an online library of tens of thousands of albums with Napster®, Spotify or Slacker Premium.
- Access SiriusXM online without having to install an antenna.

- Create custom radio stations via Pandora or Slacker Radio.
- Browse thousands of AM and FM radio broadcasts around the world using TuneIn Internet Radio service.
- Synchronize with Apple iCloud. (Requires the Media Sync and iTunes software to be installed). This synchronization allows access to media anywhere in the world using any iOS or Android device or web browser.
- Synchronize the content of multiple MMS Servers located anywhere on the planet using Google Drive.
- Play content from any Android or iOS device through a home audio system using Spotify Connect available on each audio output on the MMS.

The MMS provides access to several online music services via an Internet connection, such as PANDORA®, SiriusXM, Spotify, Slacker, Napster and TuneIn.

Autonomic is constantly working to develop partnerships with content service providers to bring even more of the best Internet-delivered media through future firmware updates.



Local Content

To keep libraries organized, the MMS comes preloaded with software to install onto a Mac or PC that automatically keeps music files and playlists synchronized with the server. This software can be downloaded from the server onto the computers once the MMS is setup on the home network. Whenever new content is added to the computer, the MMS Media Sync software automatically catalogs it and sends it to the MMS server for on-demand playback. The MMS can be configured to stream content from a NAS device or other shared network storage as well.

Cloud Synchronization Features

The MMS can synchronize with Google Drive™ and Apple iCloud™ (iCloud requires the MMS Media Sync and iTunes software to be installed). This unique feature provides several distinct benefits:

1. All content can be bidirectionally synchronized with MMS servers at multiple locations by entering the same credentials at each site.
2. All content is securely backed up off site on Google or Apple servers. (Confirm)
3. The entire library can be accessed in nearly any location using a number of different applications available on Android and Apple iOS mobile devices or with your laptop.
4. The MMS can be configured so that any time new music is purchased either in the home or with a mobile device, it is automatically added to the home library (or other connected locations).

TuneBridge

TuneBridge™ technology can easily switch between online services and purchased music in a library. Mixed queues and playlists can be created with content from Napster, Spotify and the local music collection. TuneBridge can instantly queue up an entire album with Napster or Spotify, or play a custom Pandora or Slacker radio station with similar music from a song played from the local library, online radio or streaming service.

Control System Integration

The MMS Media Server is designed to work seamlessly in an automated home environment. Autonomic works closely with all leading control system manufacturers to ensure the smoothest operation and access to all features of the MMS on control system touch panels or automation applications. Autonomic has partnered with Crestron, AMX, Control4, URC, RTI, Savant, Elan, Command Fusion, Bitwise Controls, and Key Digital to provide modules, UI templates and other tools needed for a successful integration.



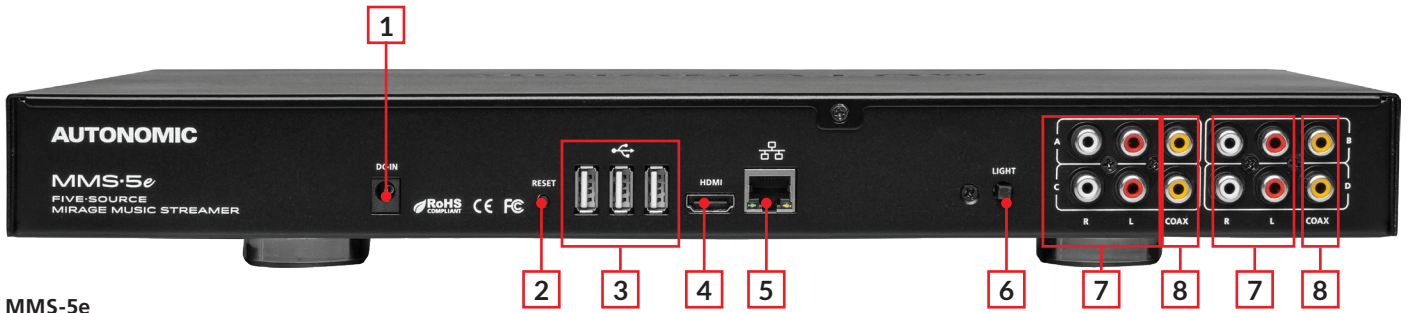

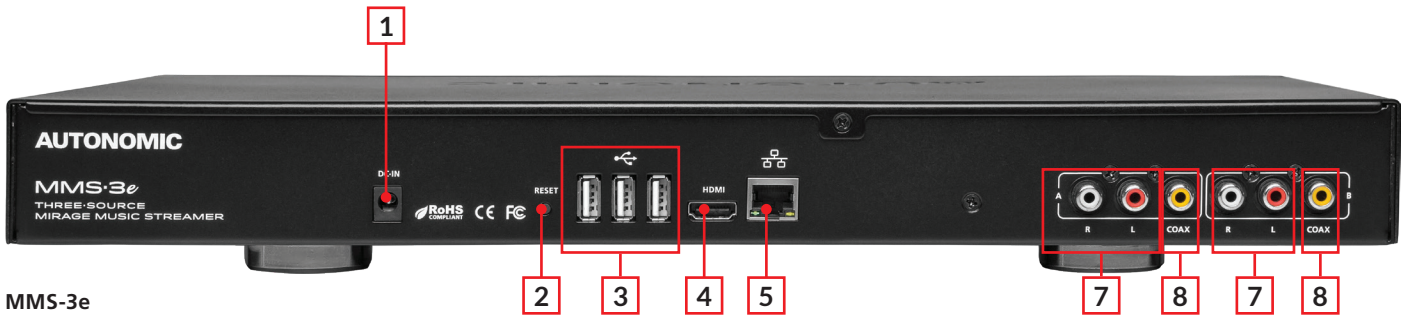

- 1. Infra-Red Receiver (5e and 1e Only)**
Receiver for front panel IR control (Used only for amplifier control, not IR pass through). A remote not supplied, however an IRC profile is located at:
www.Autonomic-Controls.com/Support/
- 2. Power Indicator (5e and 1e Only)**
Lights blue when AC power is supplied.
Note: The power button lights blue on the 3e when power is supplied.
- 3. Chassis Feet**
Provide unrestricted air-flow through the chassis for convection cooling.
- 4. Power Button**
Press to manually power on and off the server. Illuminates when powered on.
- 5. Rack Mount Ears (Optional)**
To mount the server in a rack. (Not pictured)

1. **AC Inlet**
Connect power source to this port.
2. **Reset Button**
Press to soft reset the server.
Note: Press and hold the reset button for 10 seconds while the server powers on to factory reset. Progress of the reset can be displayed on screen via the HDMI output.
3. **USB Ports**
To connect an external hard drive for additional storage.
4. **HDMI Port**
To connect a display for set up and "Now Playing" information.
5. **Ethernet Port**
Ethernet port for connection to the Home network.
6. **Light Switch (5e only)**
Press to turn on the light bar.
7. **Zone Pre Amplifier Out**
Analog Audio L/R zone outputs
8. **Coax Digital Source Output Terminals** Coax digital outputs for expansion to further amplifier zones.

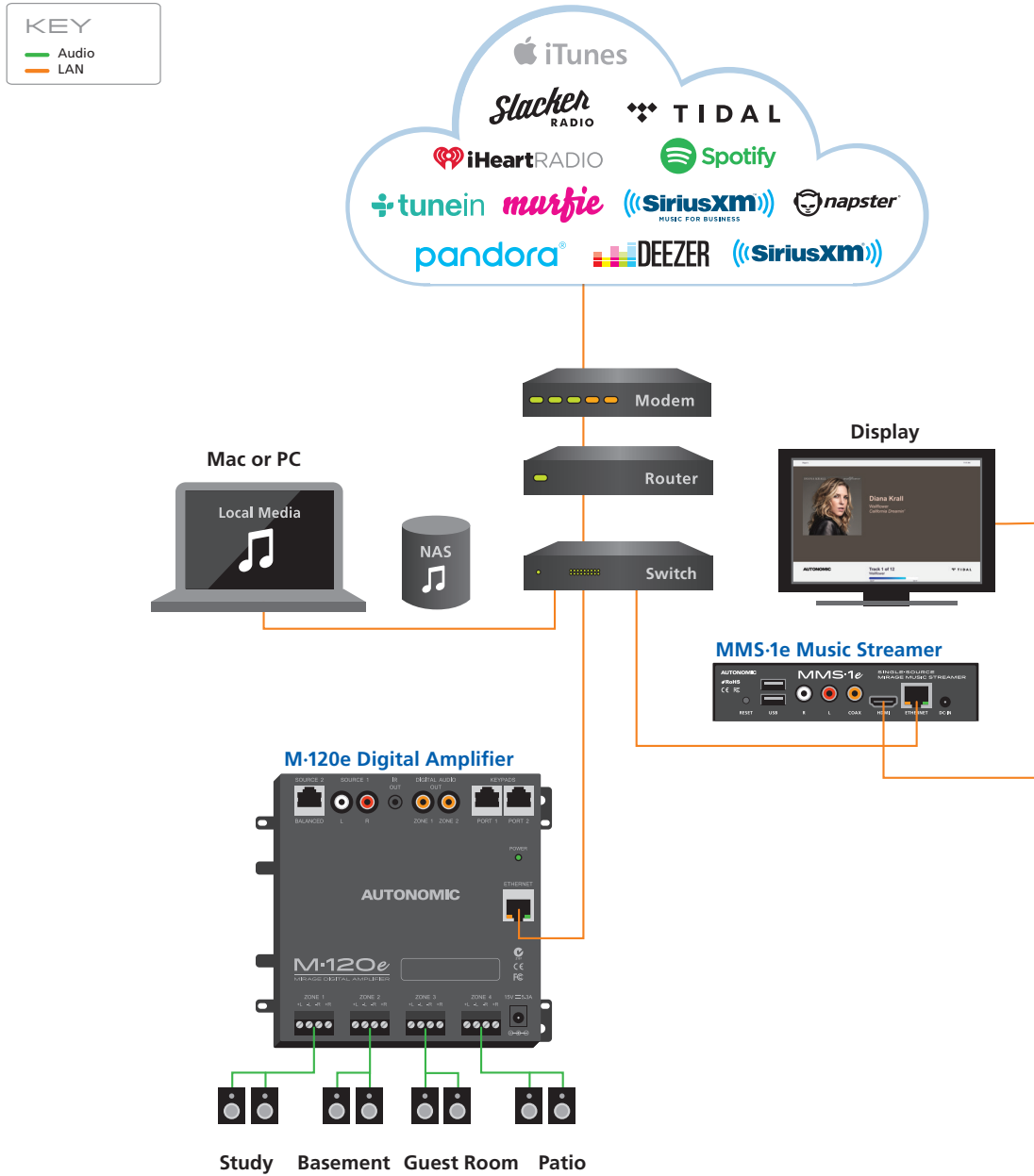

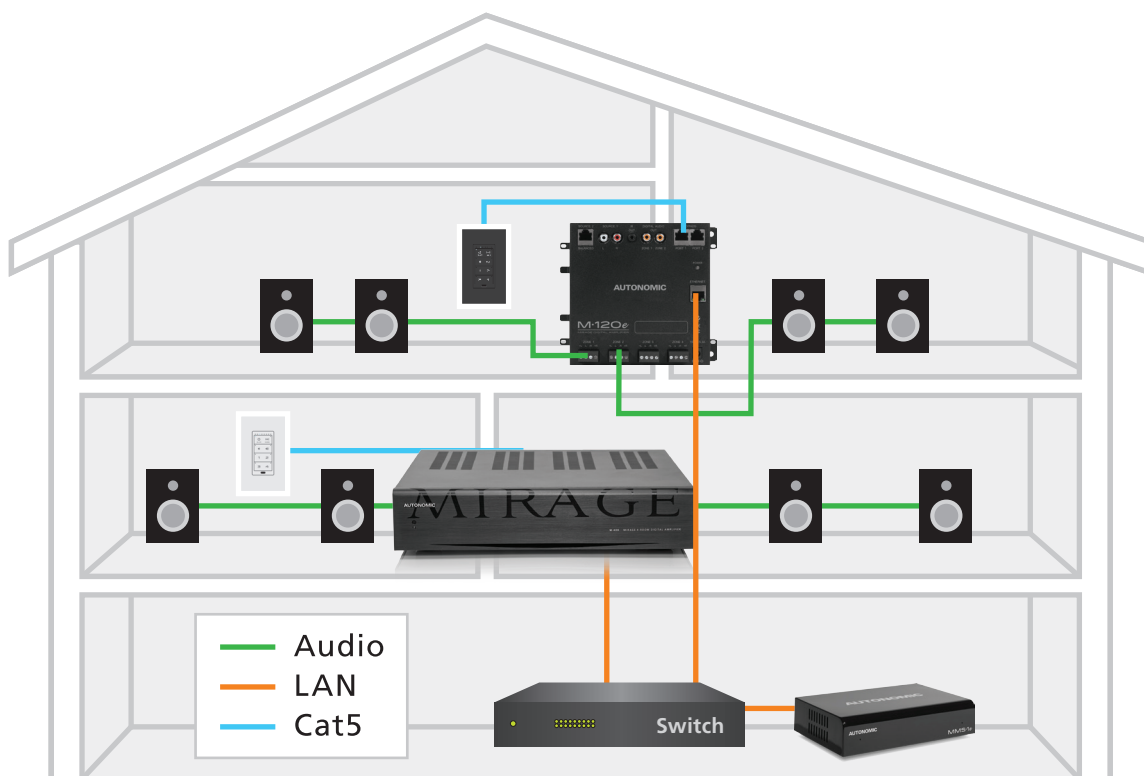
This section provides an overview of powering up the server for the first time and using the MMS Configuration Utility to configure the device.

NOTE Plug everything in and connect all wires before powering up. It is recommended to attach a display when first powering up the server as the IP address will be on screen.

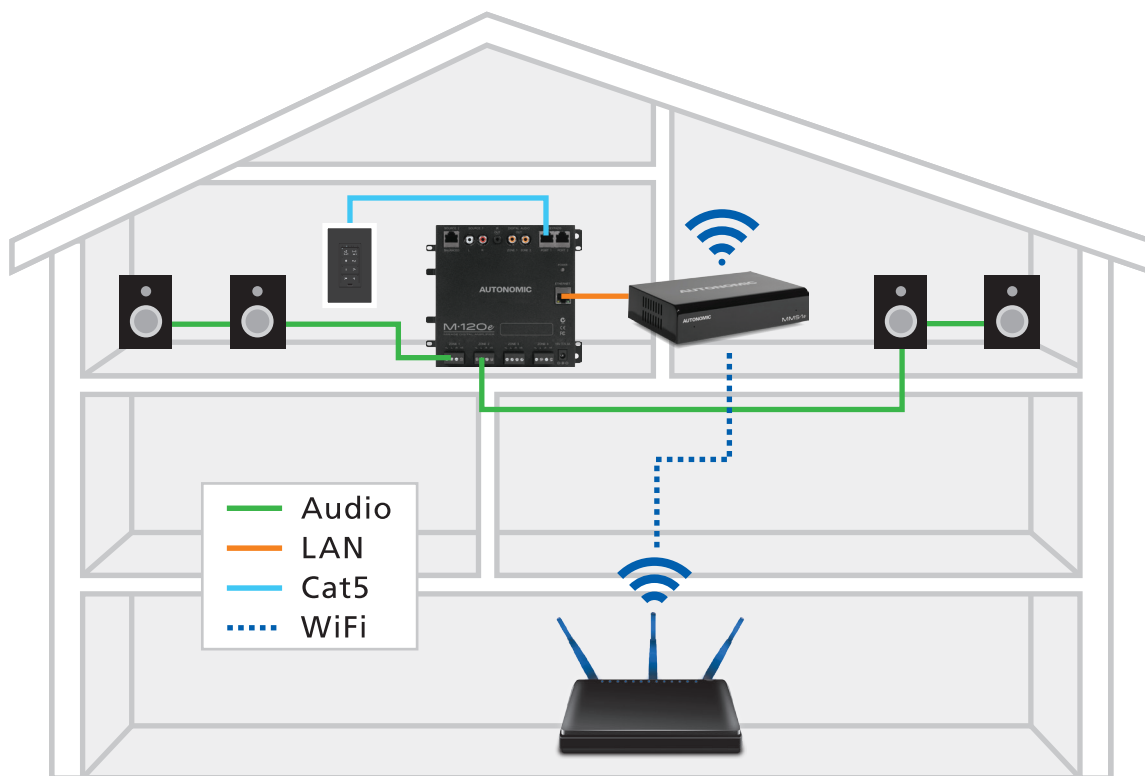
Once all necessary connections are made, press the power button located on the front of the unit once to turn on the MMS. The power button will illuminate.

Wait 2-3 minutes for the server to completely boot up. If the server is connected to a video display, wait until the Now Playing screen shows on the display.

MMS - Web Configuration

Initial configuration of the MMS is accomplished through a web browser using the MMS web interface. Launch Internet Explorer or Google Chrome and enter the URL as such: **http://<Server-IP>/config**. For example, if the IP address of the MMS is 192.168.1.10, the URL for accessing the Web Configuration is **http://192.168.1.10/config**.

Configuration is broken up into Tabs (Machine, System, Content, Schedule, Control Systems and Firmware).

Machine Tab

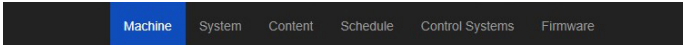

The Machine tab allows setup for important functions such as server identification, remote management, access security, time zone and IP network settings.

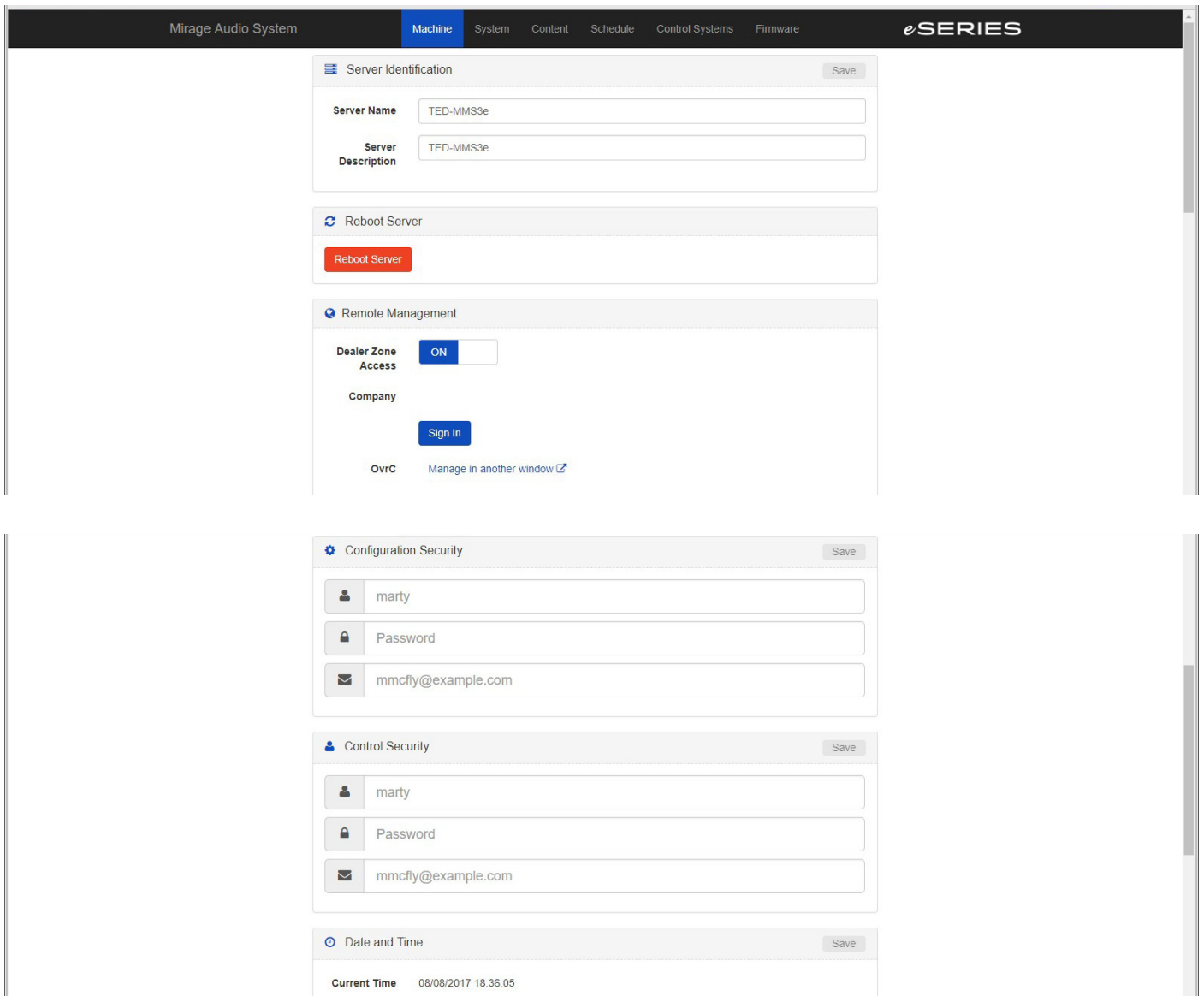
1. Server Identification:
 - a. Name: Displays the MMS network name.
 - b. Description: Provide an optional text description for the server.

TIP: For easier remote management through the OvrC interface, it is recommended that an identifying Name and Description are added.

2. Reboot Server: Restarts the system
3. Remote Management: Grant remote access via DealerZone or OvrC to the third party indicated. If access is toggled off, remote management is disabled.

TIP: Register this device with an OvrC account by entering your credentials in a separate window.

4. Configuration Security: Optionally password protect the MMS configuration page to prevent unauthorized/unintended configuration changes. This is desirable when the system is installed in a commercial or public location.
 - a. User/Password: Enter the user name and password to gain access to the config page.
 - b. Recovery email address: Password recovery emails are sent to this email address after 3 unsuccessful login attempts.
5. Control Security: Optionally password protect the MMS Web Player. This prevents unauthorized audio playback and may be desirable in a commercial or public location.
 - a. User/Password: The user name and password to gain access to the web player.
 - b. Recovery email address: Password recovery emails will be sent to this email address after 3 unsuccessful login attempts.



6. Date and Time
 - a. Date: Current time and date
 - b. Time Zone: Select the time zone for your device.
 - c. Time Server: Select a preferred NTP server in reasonable geographic proximity.

TIP: The time zone must be set prior to pressing the NTP sync button for accurate timekeeping. Failure to configure time or time zone properly may result in some features not functioning correctly.
7. Wired Networking: Displays the device's network configuration.
 - a. Connection: Configure the device for either DHCP or static IP address. The device must be properly configured with an IP address, gateway, subnet mask and DNS to allow connection to the Internet.

TIP: Configure the server network connection to automatically use a network DHCP server to obtain its IP address and network settings, or manually specify a static IP setting.
8. The following details must be entered if using a static address:
 - a. IP Address: The unique address of the server on the local network.
 - b. Subnet mask: The subnet mask for the local network (commonly 255.255.255.0).

- c. Gateway: The IP address for the router. This is necessary for the MMS to access the Internet.
 - d. DNS 1 & 2: IP addresses providing Domain Name Services.
 - i. DNS 1: Suggested server: OpenDNS [208.67.222.222]
 - ii. DNS 2: Suggested server: Google's DNS [8.8.8.8]
9. Wireless Networking – Enter WiFi settings here for models with wireless support. It is recommended to use a wired connection for optimal network performance and reliability whenever possible.
 - a. SSID: Choose from the available SSIDs from the drop-down list.
 - b. Encryption: Select the configured encryption for the WiFi network.
 - c. Password: Enter the wireless password for the SSID device
 - d. Configure for DHCP or Static IP address as directed in the Wired Network instructions above.
 - e. Select Go Wireless to save the settings.
 - f. If configuring the MMS with an eSeries amplifier, connect an Ethernet cable directly from the network port of the MMS to the network port of the eSeries Amplifier.

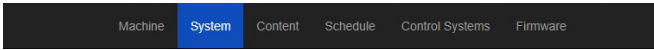
Configure Wireless Network

You are about to activate Wireless mode. A direct Cat5 connection from MMS to eSeries amplifier is required *after activation*. Upon successful activation, data will be received wirelessly on the MMS.

Warning: Wireless mode requires the MMS and eSeries amplifier to use a direct, hardwired Cat5 connection. Once wireless mode is activated, **access to the configuration page will use the assigned wireless IP address.**

In order to revert back to a Wired Networking configuration, the MMS and amplifier(s) will require a direct network connection **before** exiting Wireless mode. **Please see the Wireless Networking knowledgebase article for details**

System Tab



The System tab contains configuration for audio settings and system outputs on the MMS and connected devices.

1. System

- a. System Id: The ID of the MMS device **group**. Communication between eSeries devices (servers and amplifiers) is enabled when sharing the same System ID. By default, eSeries devices are configured for System ID 1 and therefore will automatically link together.

TIP: Leaving the system ID at 1 (auto-join) will allow new eSeries devices to be visible when added to the system. Changing the System ID will create an isolated music system **

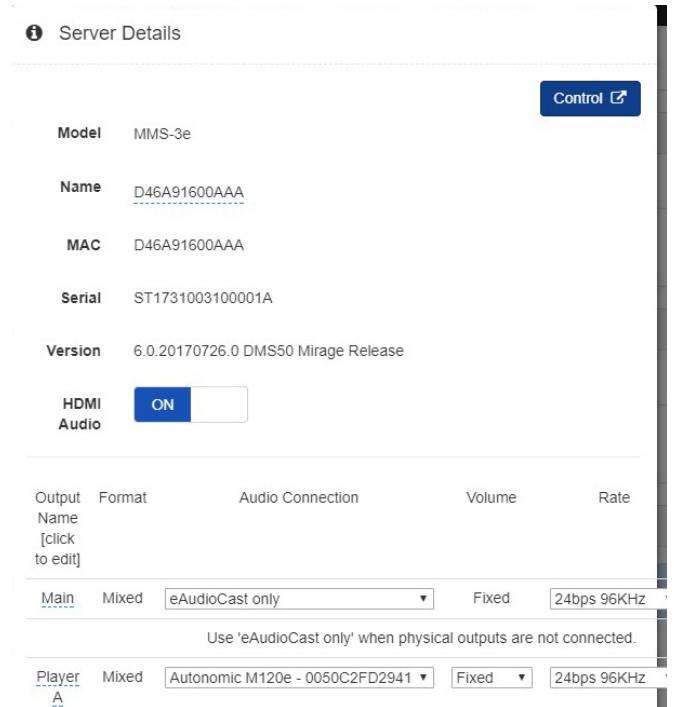
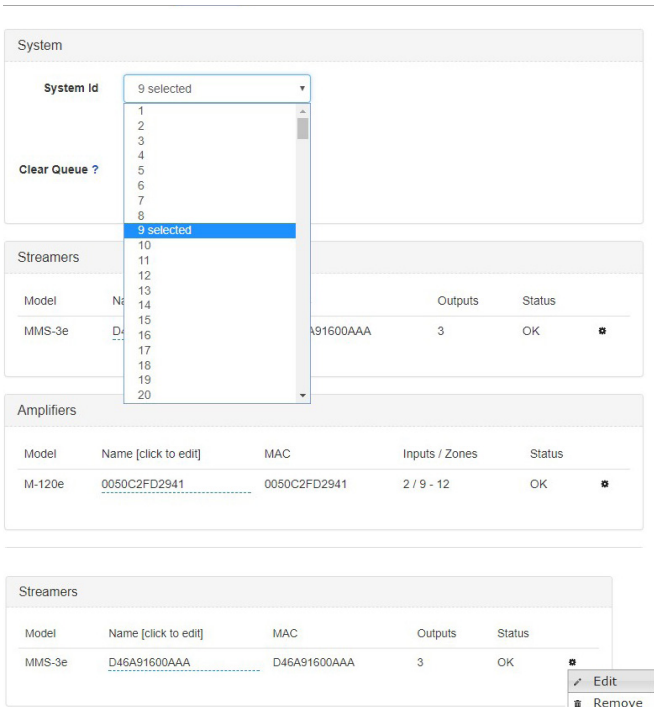
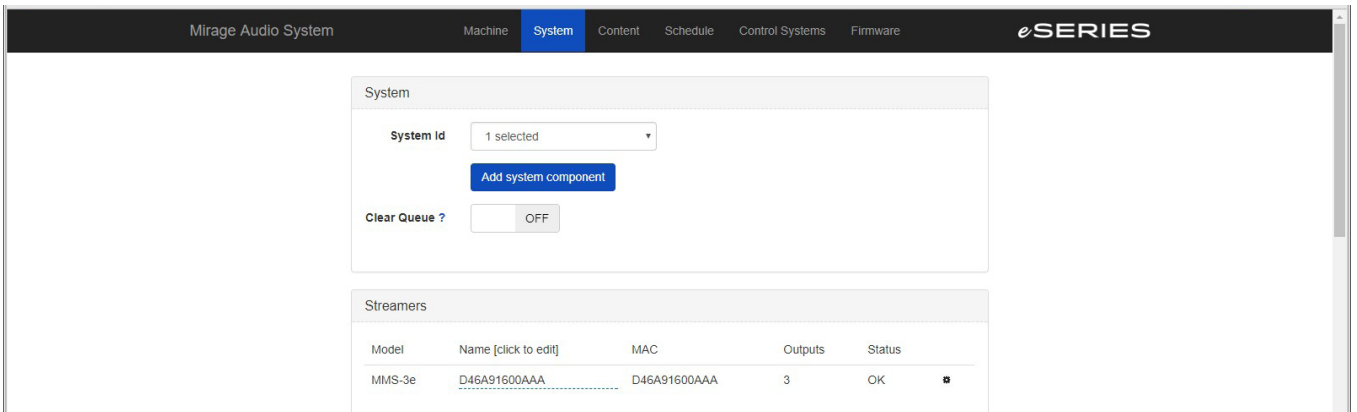
- b. Add system component: Discover additional network connected devices on another System ID. Adding the device will reconfigure it with your System ID.

- c. Clear Queue – When set to “on” empties the queue when the last zone listening to an audio source is turned off. When toggled off, the MMS queues remain intact, even if the zones are powered off.

- 2. Streamers: Lists all MMS devices sharing the same System Id. Click the gear icon to edit a device’s configuration or remove the device from this System Id.

TIP: When using System Id 1 (auto-join), eSeries devices can only be removed if they are offline. Otherwise, removing an eSeries device will reset its System Id back to 1 (default).

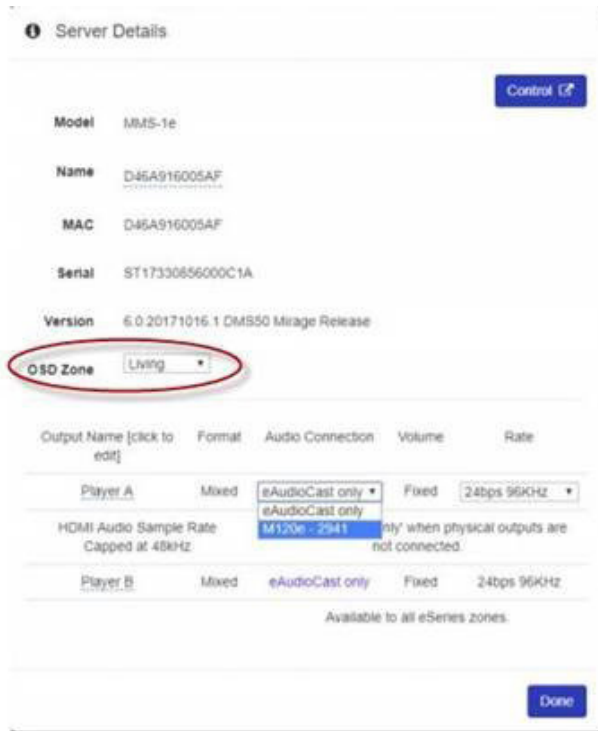
- a. Server Details: Lists information such as Model, Serial Number and Firmware version of the device
- b. Click on the Name field to edit the System name of the selected device.
- c. Click on the Output name to modify its default label. (e.g. Player A). When used with eSeries amplifiers, sources are automatically managed and generally not exposed in control clients (except in the MMS Web Client). Therefore when using eSeries amplifier(s) editing the default Output names is unnecessary.



TIP: The HDMI output of the MMS servers can be assigned to whatever output necessary for the system design.

Click the gear on the system tab, then choose the zone for the HDMI output port. Select "Done" when finished.

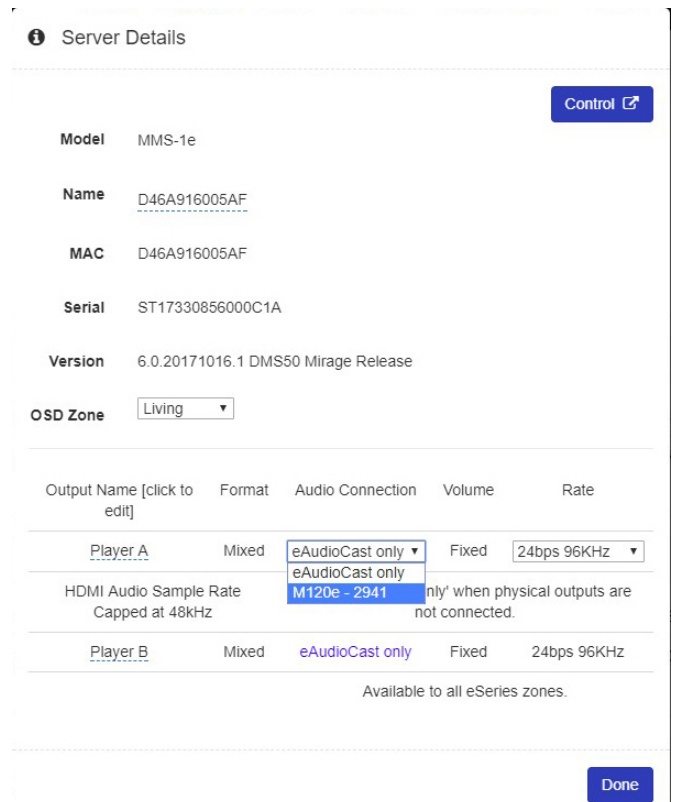

TIP: For controlThe HDMI OUT system programming, the server will respond to commands issued using the default output names, as well as commands issued using custom names.

- d. Configure audio details for each configured MMS output by following the below guidance.
 - i. Output Name: Editable text label for the source output (Player)
 - ii. Format: Displays output type
 01. Mixed - Physical and eAudioCast
 02. eAudioCast - output available on the network
 - iii. Audio Connection
 01. Zone Player - Treats the output as a controllable audio endpoint.
 02. eAudioCast Only
 03. Amplifier (displays grouped amplifiers)
 - iv. Volume - Sets the gain as Fixed or Variable.
 01. Fixed: The MMS gain is preset and volume is adjusted at the amplifier.
 02. Variable: The gain can be adjusted by the MMS Player or other control system.
 - v. Rate - The bit depth and sample rate resolution of the source output signal.)

Note: When a 1e is paired with a 120e amplifier, Player B will only have an option for an eAudioCast Audio Connection.



Bit Depth and Sample Rate Resolution

Bit depth and sample rate of the digital audio outputs can be set to values from 16-bit/44 kHz, up to 24-bit/192 kHz.

Set this value to the highest setting that the connected amplifier or AV receiver can support. If the highest supported bit depth and sample rate on the connected equipment is not known, the MMS will play a sample sound in each speaker whenever this setting is changed. If the test tone is audible, that setting is supported by the amplifier. If the test tone is not audible, lower this setting until the test signal is audible.

Audio Player Screen

The Audio Player Screen is accessible by entering the streamer IP address in a web browser, or by clicking the "Control" button on the "Server Details" screen in the streamer configuration screen on the System Tab.

Note: The MMS player requires flash to operate.



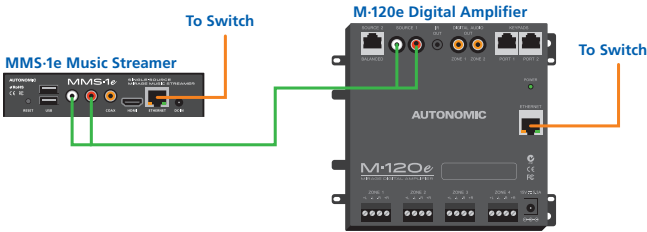
Using the MMS with eSeries Amplification

Audio can be delivered to the eSeries amplifier either via eAudioCast or a traditional physical cable connection (e.g. Digital Coax). Audio rates up to 24bps/192KHz are supported when physically connected (e.g. using RCA digital coax cables) to eSeries amplifiers.

TIP: Review the "System Tab" section on page 11 to bring one or more eSeries amplifiers into the System ID group for configuration.

Physical cable connection: Connect the MMS to an available amplifier source input. For each MMS Player output, identify the amplifier and the specific source input connected on the amplifier config page.

eAudioCast: Connect a Player from the MMS to playback to an available amplifier with audio quality up to 24bps/96KHz output.

TIP: Sources can be “eAudioCast only” or “Mixed” format. “eAudioCast only” means that the audio source is available over Ethernet to be received by an eAudioCast capable device. “Mixed” format means the source is available on a physical MMS output as well as (mirrored) over Ethernet to eAudiocast capable devices.

Amplifiers: Lists any supported amplifiers sharing the same System ID. Click the gear icon to edit device configuration.

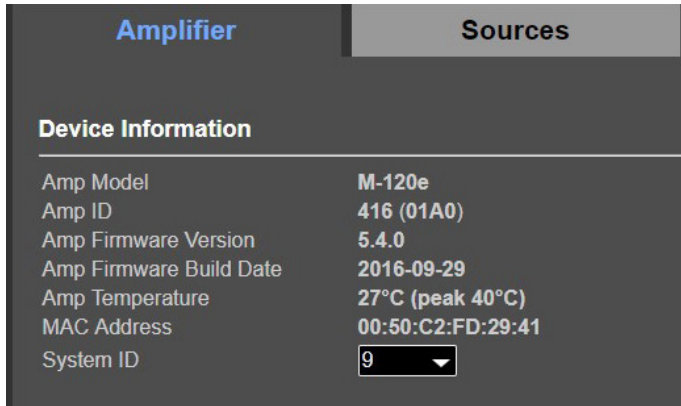

Amplifier Configuration

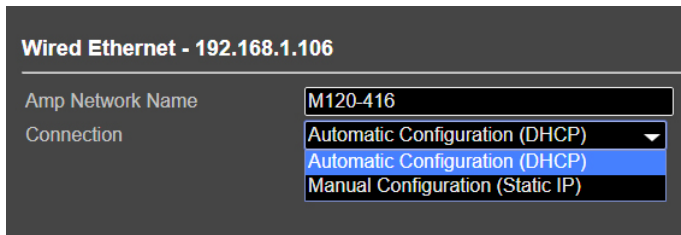
Click the Gear icon under the Amplifier field, click “Edit”, then click the “Configure” button on the Amp Details screen to configure the connected amplifiers.

Amplifier Tab

Device Information: Displays the device information for the connected amplifier. The System ID field notes the system ID which is assigned to the amplifier. Changing the system ID will change the system to which this amplifier is assigned. This is useful when there are two or more streamer and amplifier systems set up in one residence.



Wired Ethernet: Network to which the amp is assigned is displayed here. Choose whether to configure the amplifier to use a static IP or DHCP. Use a static IP to reserve the IP address for devices on the network. This can help reduce opportunity for connectivity errors. Improperly setting up IP settings can lead to connectivity issues.



Important: Clicking "Save Changes" for each tab is necessary to save all changes.

Sources Tab

Physical Source: Displays the actual source of the connected amplifier. The number of sources available for name assignments depends on how many are available on the amplifier connected.



Source Name: Displays the name assigned to each source connected to the amplifier. The name chosen here will display on all keypads connected. Keep device names to a maximum of 15 characters.



Source Gain: Set the gain for sources connected to the amplifier via analog inputs.



Zones Tab

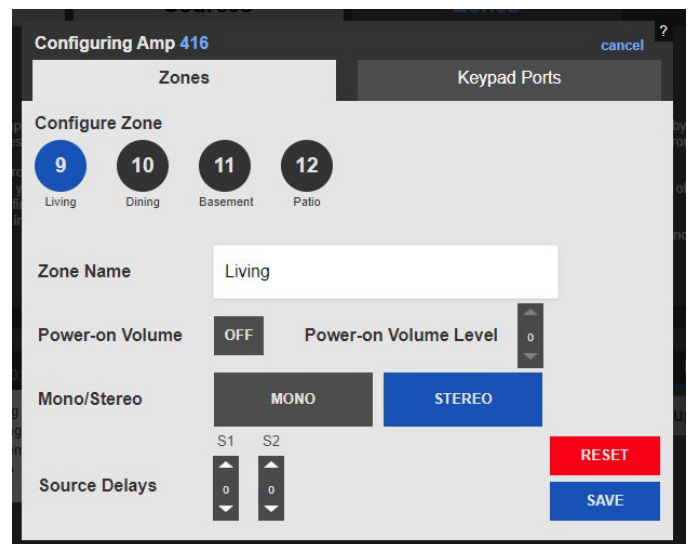
Zone Settings: Rename the zones for any linked amplifiers as they appear on keypads. Names here also have a 15 character limit. Zones appear grouped to the corresponding amplifier. Amps and their zones are displayed in the order as discovered by the server on the network.

Note: It is not necessary to connect all amplifiers in a chain (loopout connected amps) to the network. Only connect the first amplifier via Ethernet. The server will locate the zones from the connected amplifier.

Click the configure button to configure each zone.



Amplifier Zone Configuration



Configure Zone: Choose which zone to configure.

Zone Name: The zone name can be changed here as well as on the initial Amplifier configuration screen. Changing the zone name here will also change the zone name where ever else it is displayed, provided the save button is pressed.

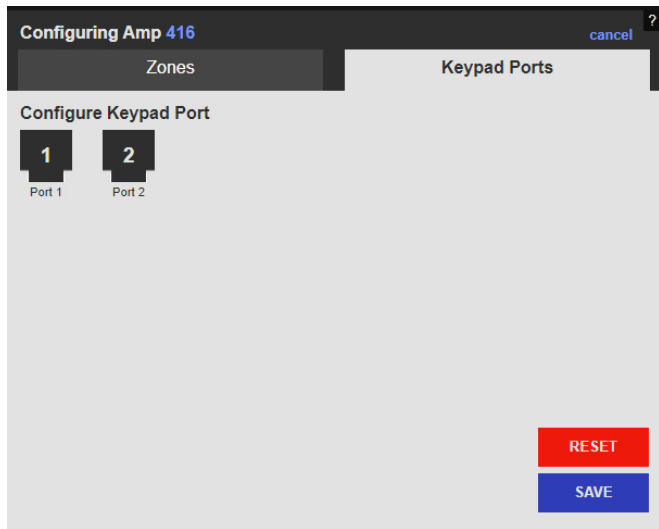
Power On Volume: Set the volume level of that zone when powered on. Default state for this option is set to "Off". Click to set to "ON" then click the arrows next to "Power on Volume Level" to set the volume level.

Mono/Stereo: Set the Zone to Mono or Stereo Output.

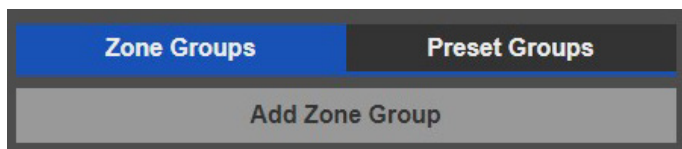
Source Delays: Set the number of seconds to delay playback from a source.

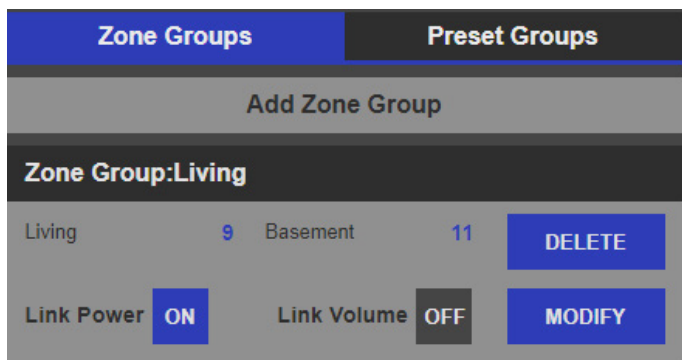


Configure Keypad Port: Configure any keypads connected to the amplifier. (Look up options). Unresponsive keypads can be reset from this screen.

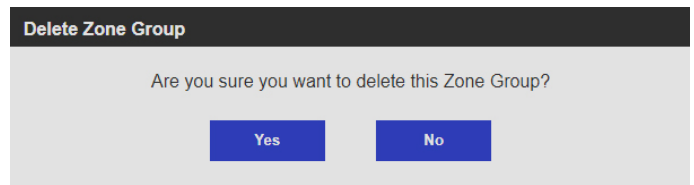


Zone Groups: Zone Groups can be configured to be linked by power, Volume or both. Zones in a group are unlimited, however a single zone can only be included in a single group.

Click "Add Zone Group", then click on the zone to add it to the new zone group. Click "Save" once all desired zones have been added to the group.



Once the zone group is created, it will be named after the lowest numbered zone in the group. Choose to link power, volume or both. Click "Modify" to add or remove zones from the group, then click "Save" to retain changes. Clicking "Delete" will remove the zone group.

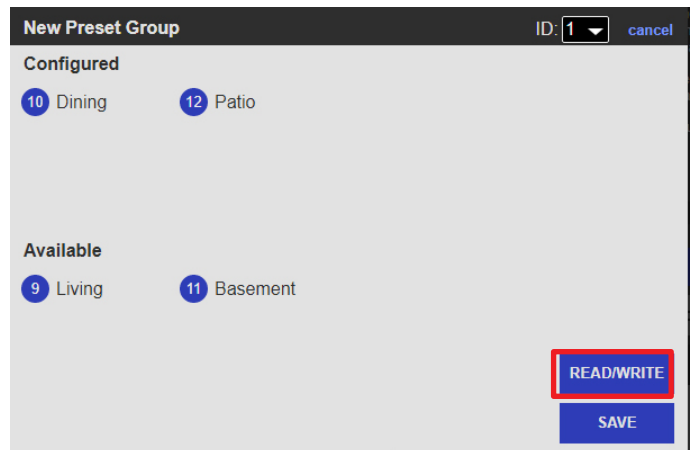


Click "Delete" then click "Yes" to confirm and remove the zone group.

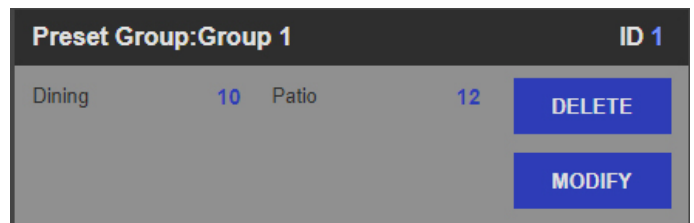
Preset Groups: Preset groups assign zones to the same preset slots on connected Servers. Assign Preset Groups with easily identifiable names, and set to read only to prevent end user changes. Zone group inclusion does not exclude a zone from being included in a Preset group.

Click "Add Preset Group", then click on the zone to add it to the new zone group. Click "Save" once all desired zones have been added to the group.

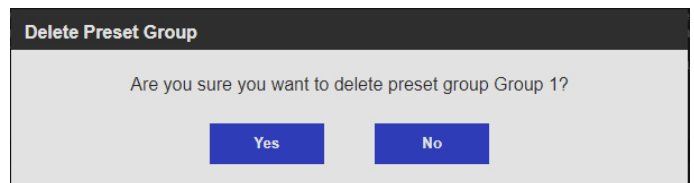
Click "Read/Write" to change the property of the Preset group to "Read Only" Conversely, Click "Read Only" To set the property to "Read/Write".



Once the zone group is created, it will be named "Group 1".



Click "Modify" to add or remove zones from the group, then click "Save" to retain changes. Clicking "Delete" will remove the zone group.



Click "Delete" then click "Yes" to confirm and remove the preset group.

Using the MMS with Third-Party Amplifiers

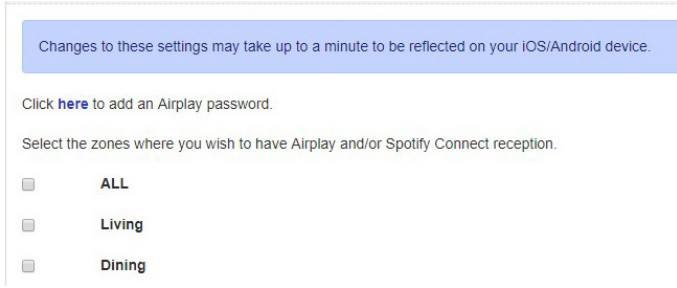
Audio Connection: Set to "Zone Player" when connecting to a third-party amplifier or control system.

Fixed Volume: The MMS output will be fixed at 100% volume. Control the volume using the available methods from the third-party amplifier or control system vendor.

Variable Volume: Set the volume to variable only if using the MMS without a control system or controllable amplifier and require volume to be adjusted on the MMS.

TIP: Verify the maximum supported audio rate of the third-party amplifier when connecting it to the MMS via digital audio.

Using Spotify Connect The Spotify section allows assignment of outputs on the MMS to be Spotify Connect receivers. When enabled, the MMS is displayed on the Spotify menu of any device or software that supports Connect (iOS devices and Android Devices).



NOTE: In a MMS Audio System configuration, Spotify will be displayed on the Spotify Connect menu of any device or software that supports it (iOS and Android devices and Spotify running on a Mac or PC) as zone names.

When the MMS is selected, any currently playing content will be interrupted and the server will begin to wirelessly stream the content from the connected device.

This can be overridden by selecting any other content for playback through the MMS web interface, mobile applications, or IP control.

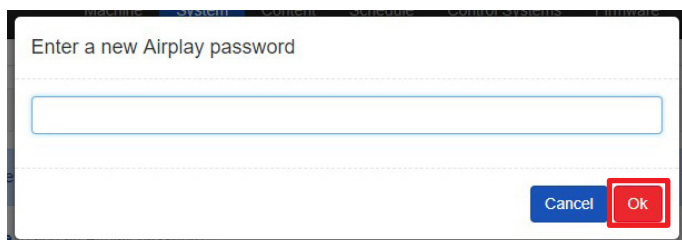
The optional password allows a password to be set that the user of the mobile device (or iTunes) will be prompted for before the MMS will accept a stream from the device. This will prevent uninvited transmissions from being broadcast to the amplifier.

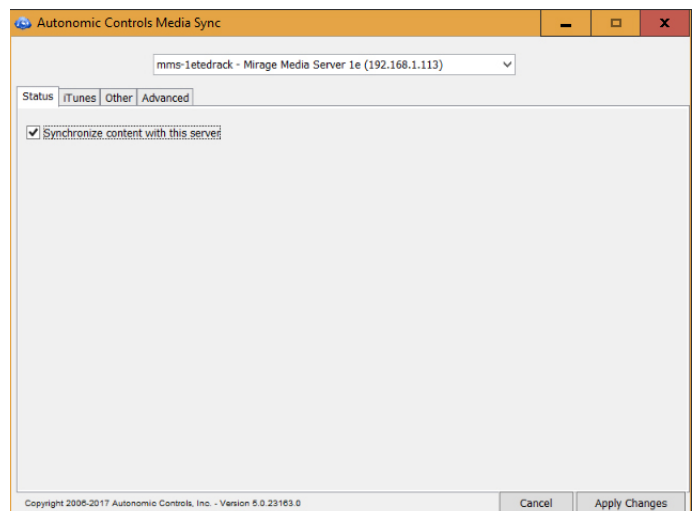
1. Media Options
 - a. Overlay on Albums - By default, the album art is displayed unadulterated. Select the check box to overlay the artwork with the artist and album name.
 - b. Export Media Catalog - Downloads a .csv file with local library catalog details, such as Name, Artist, Album, Genre, etc.



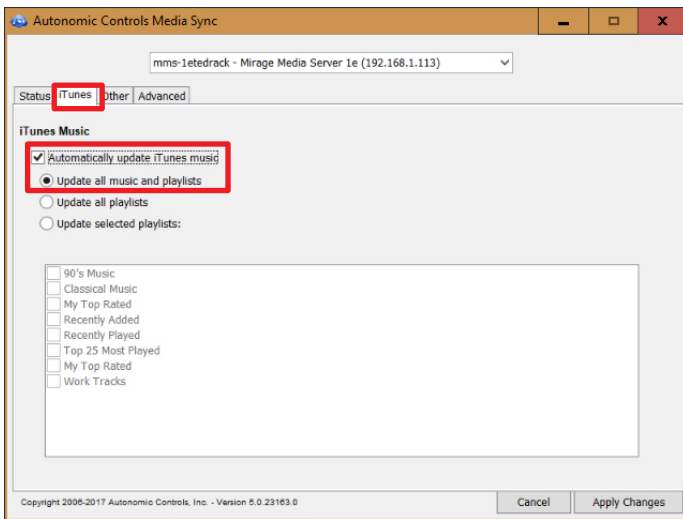
2. Synchronized Computers - The MMS Media Sync software allows synchronization of music libraries on another device with the MMS. This software is provided for both Windows and Macintosh and must be installed on the device in the home containing the source music. Clicking on either link will download the software to your PC to be installed. Double click the file to install.



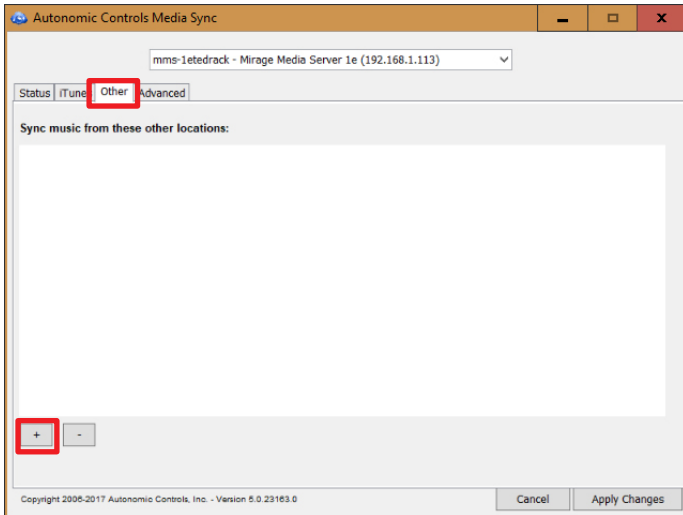
- a. Once Media Sync is installed, select the server which will synchronize content, and select the option to synchronize with that server if desired.



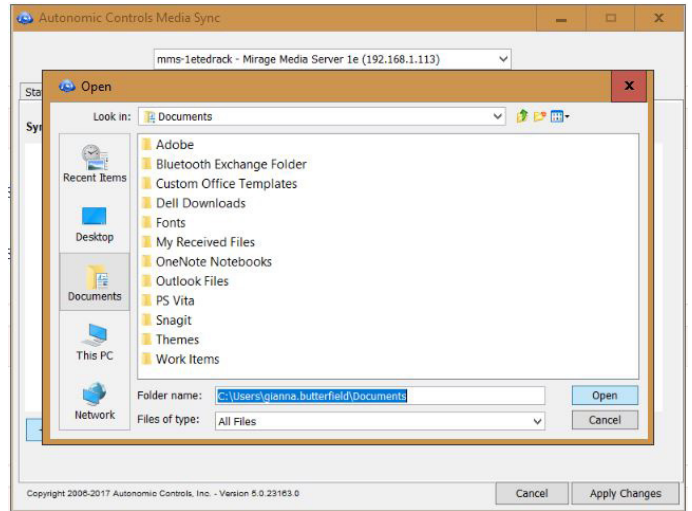
- b. Select options to synchronize all music, or selected playlists in iTunes if available.



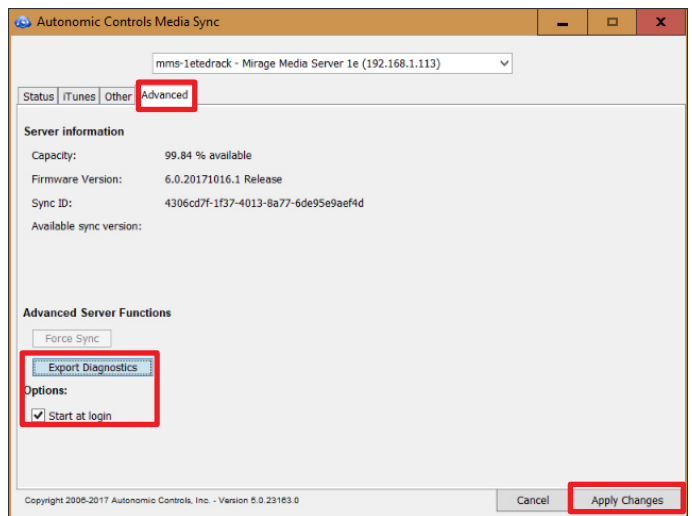
- c. Other locations on the network can also be synchronized. Click the "+" to add an other location from which to synchronize more music.



- d. Navigate to the appropriate folder location on the network, then click "save", to synchronize that network folder location.



- e. Click on the "Advanced Tab" to see server information, export diagnostics and change Media Sync startup options.



- f. Click "Apply Changes" to save.

7. Network Storage - complete this section to allow the streamer to access music stored on a network location.

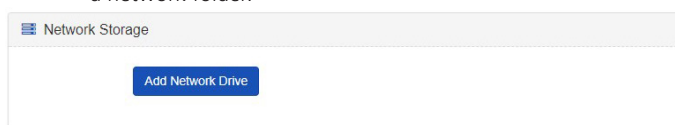
NOTE: This method has a few caveats for consideration.

- This content will only be available for playback when the NAS device or computer hosting the files is online.
- The MMS cannot read playlists from iTunes or Windows Media Player using this method since those playlists reside inside special databases that are only accessible to the MMS when the files are transferred.
- Playback can be affected by local network performance.

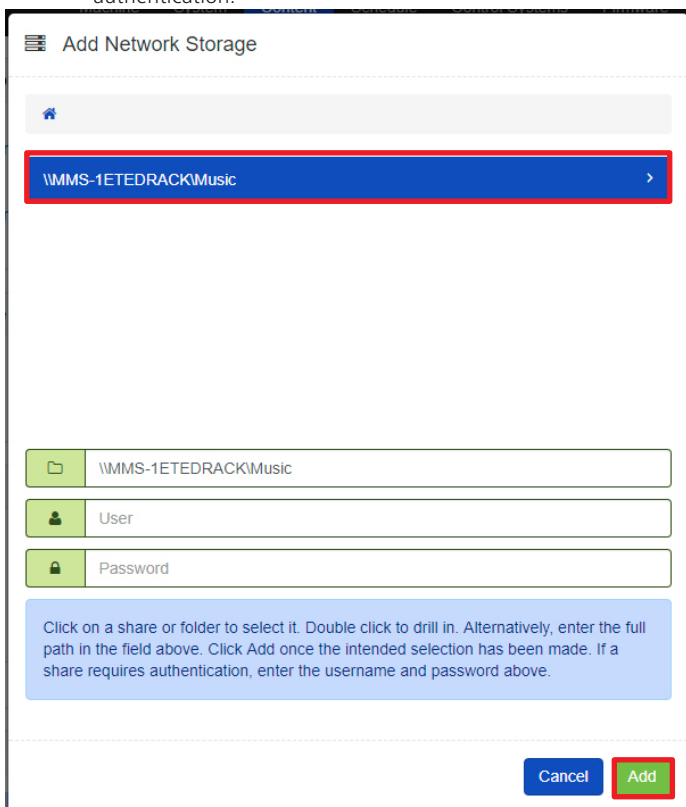
For these reasons, synchronizing the content to the MMS rather than streaming it may provide a more stable experience.

If a local library is too large to fit on the MMS internal hard drive, use the MMS Media Sync software to selectively synchronize selected playlists, then use the NAS streaming method to provide access to the rest of the content, or attach an external USB.

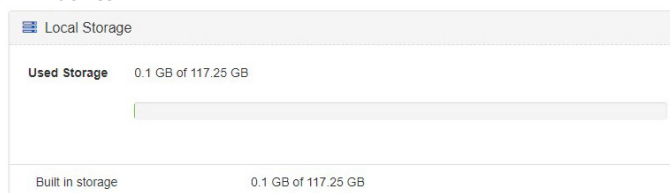
- a. Click "Add Network Drive" to add storage from a NAS drive or a network folder.



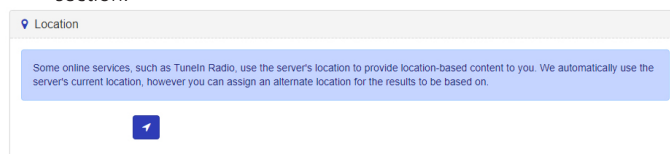

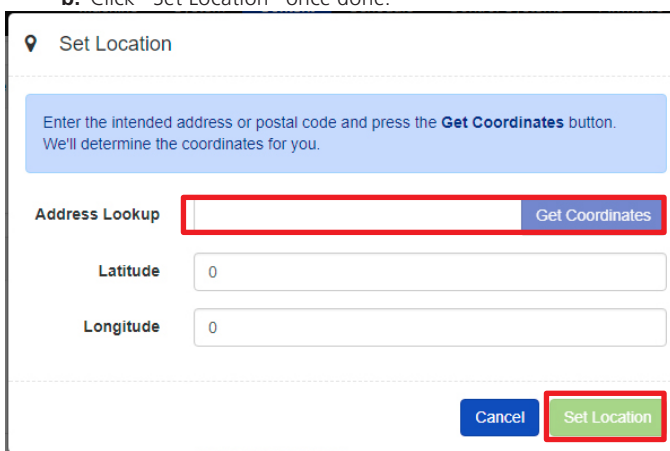

9. Location. Certain online services use the location of the server for location based content. Change the default location in this section.

Adding Digital Content and Configuring Cloud Services

The Content tab allows account credentials to be entered for streaming media services and cloud services supported by the MMS.

Google Drive

The MMS can interface with a Google account to synchronize content to and from the cloud from multiple locations.

To enable this feature, click the gear in the right side, and select "Add account". Enter a Google user ID and password, and select one or both options for copying content to or from Google online storage.



The MMS will synchronize all music files with Google online storage, even uncompressed FLAC or WAV files. These files will be stored in the Google account and will be available for multi-location synchronization.

Synchronizing Multiple Servers Via Google

MMS synchronization does not require any one unit to be designated as the master. The server accomplishes bidirectional synchronization with all locations.

To create a master/slave relationship between one master and one or more slaves enable only the "Copy To my Google Online Storage Account" option on the server acting as a master, and only the "Copy From my Google Online Storage Account" on the server acting as a slave.

Changes to the files synchronized to the MMS hard drive in the shared Music folder are copied to a hidden location on the MMS in order to maintain the integrity of the synchronization. These files must be modified at the source, or on Google Online storage.

iCloud Synchronization

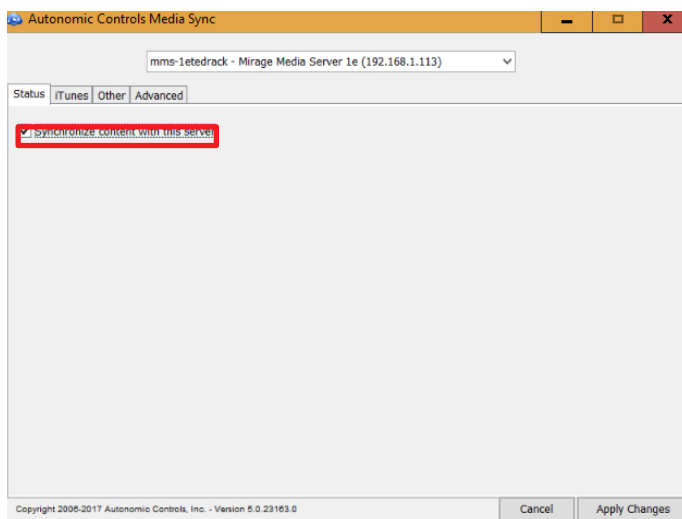
Apple's iCloud service allows synchronization of music stored on multiple computers and devices via an iCloud account. This service is supported on the MMS via MMS Media Sync software.

NOTE: Only content downloaded to the Mac or PC will synchronize with the MMS.

The following settings are recommended for the most seamless experience:

1. Turn on iTunes Match. This allows synchronization of content from other computers and devices, which in turn is synchronized to the MMS via the MMS Media Sync software.
2. Enable automatic downloads of Music purchases. This setting can be found under iTunes > Preferences > Store.

When configuring the MMS Media Sync software, select the "Synchronize content with this server" option.



Synchronizing Files and Playlists To The MMS with iCloud

To automatically synchronize content with iCloud, configure iCloud using iTunes on any computer that will host the MMS Media Sync software.

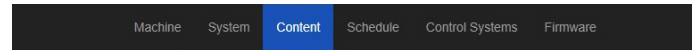
The synchronization software can be configured to synchronize all music, or individual playlists can be selected and copied to the MMS.

All content synchronized with this utility is physically copied to the MMS to provide for backup and high availability. This means that once synchronized, content on the MMS can still be played even when the computer is off.

To stop synchronizing with one of the computers, click the "X" next to the computer name to remove it from the list and remove all content contributed by that computer to the MMS library.

Streaming Music Services

Configuration of streaming music services is accomplished on the Content tab of the configuration utility in a web browser.

Pandora Internet Radio

Pandora is a service that allows creation of custom radio stations based on chosen albums or artists while including similar music from other artists and albums.

Subscribing to Pandora Paid Services will yield additional benefits on the MMS such as higher bitrate content, and commercial-free playback.

Select the gear to the right of the Pandora section under "Online Credentials" and click "Add Account". Enter Pandora credentials to associate the MMS with an online Pandora Internet Radio account.



When valid credentials are supplied, all online Pandora radio stations are available for playback on the MMS, and any new stations that created on the MMS will be saved in the online account.

The MMS supports multiple Pandora accounts, which can be created through the MMS Application (app) for iOS and Android, the MMS Web Interface and most third party control interfaces. Additionally, an existing Pandora account can be accessed through the interfaces by entering credentials when prompted.

New Pandora radio stations can be created using the MMS app, MMS Web Interface, and most third party interfaces.


The MMS TuneBridge™ technology allows creation of new Pandora stations based on any song or artist heard while playing back music from any streaming service or the local music collection. This feature can be accessed in the "Actions" menu of the MMS Web Interface and on third party control system touch panel interfaces or the TuneBridge™ icon in the iOS and Android MMS Media Controller app.

Pandora allows listening to up to six simultaneous streams with a single user ID and password on the MMS-5e, or three on the MMS-3e.

Multi-Zone, Multi-Source Switching

The M-801e amplifier has six separate amplifiers and two separate pre-amplifiers, providing 8 independent zones with integrated control. There are 12 input sources comprising the following:

- Sources 1 – 8 are either Analog Stereo, or Coax Digital Audio (PCM) Digital Coax has priority if both are connected.
- Sources 9 - 12 are either Coax (PCM) or Optical Digital Audio (TOSLINK) Only one connection is permitted to each source.
- Sources 1 -12 have a programmable delay: up to 600ms - 5ms steps.

eAudioCast

Six separate amplifiers independent yet integrated control. Multiple remote sources may be assigned, originating from a connected eSeries amplifiers and streamers.

Amplifier Physical Stacking for Zone Expansion

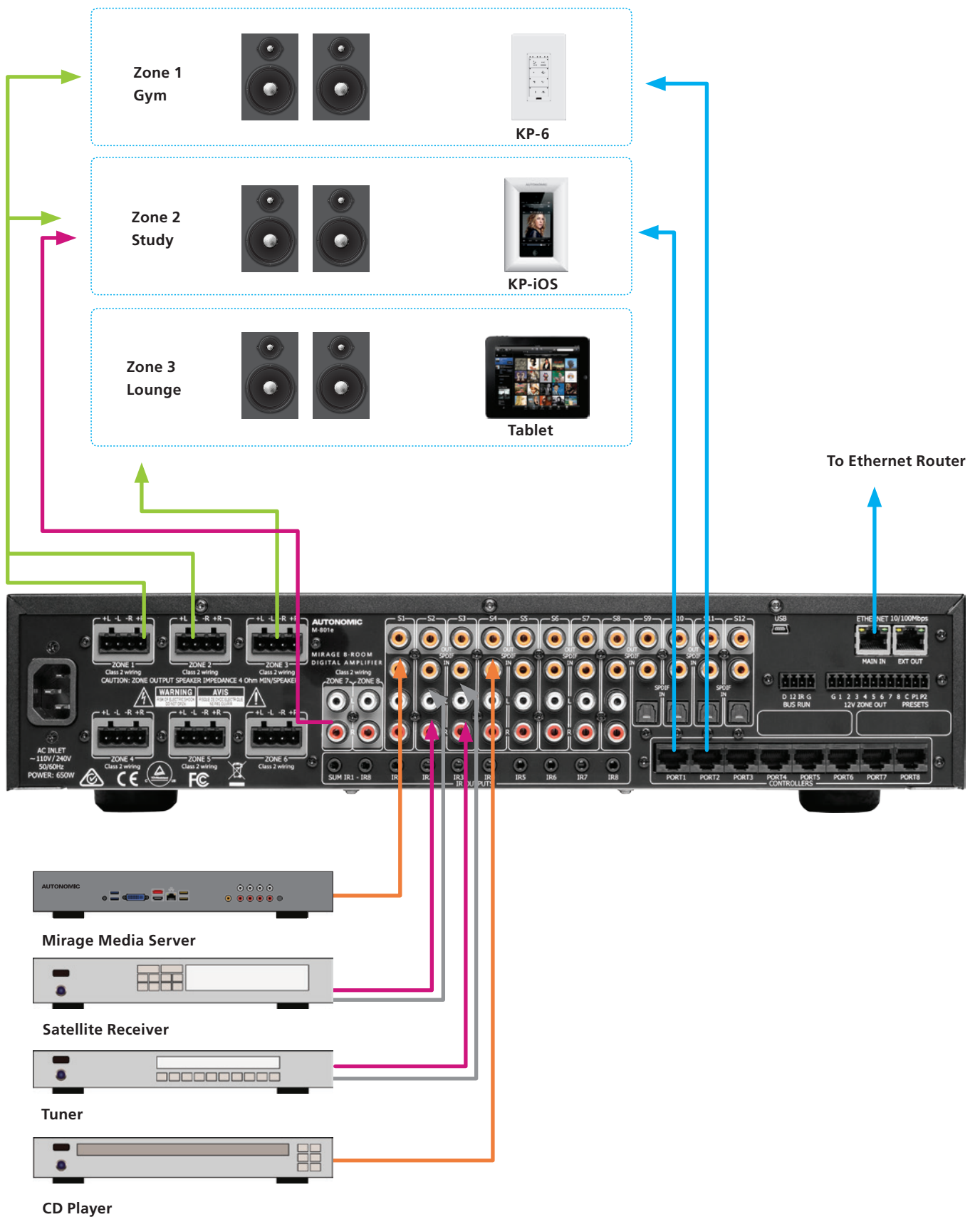

12. **Controller Interface**
For connection to keypads and IR receivers. 8 controller interface ports - RJ45 sockets.
13. **AMP ON Control**
AMP-ON 1 - 8 output 12VDC when Zone is ON.
14. **PRESETS – Door Bell**
12 – 24V AC/DC powered doorbell trigger terminals.

Fig. 1 depicts a typical configuration where the M-801e amplifier is providing audio into six of the possible eight listening zones. Only three of the zones are depicted.

Each zone consists of a room with a pair of speakers and a suitable controller. Each zone may be listening on any of the connected sources:

- Mirage Media Server
- Satellite Receiver
- Tuner
- CD Player

Controllers

Each zone has a specific control requirement. Choose controllers that best suit the application.

Zone 1 – The Gym: Speakers & KP-6 Keypad

Zone 2 – The Study: Speakers & KP-iOS Keypad

Zone 3 – The Lounge: Speakers & Tablets

1. The KP-6 Keypad may be plugged into any of the four controller ports.
2. Source control IR emitters are plugged into the IR ports. There are ten IR ports: IR1 - IR8, and IR9 & IR10.
3. IR 1 – 8 route source specific IR signals from connected controllers, while IR9 & IR10 output the common IR or the sum of all received IR signals.
4. These ports may be used for source equipment that is common to all zones.

When controlling a stand alone M-801e using an iPad or other web tablet, the M-801e must be connected to a wi-fi enabled ethernet router and the web tablet browser must be directed to the M-801e's IP Address. The M-801e's web application also provides source control functionality.

Speakers

Speakers in each zone are connected to the amplifier by "Home Run" speaker cables.

Source Equipment

The M-801e amplifier has eight stereo RCA audio inputs for connecting to source equipment. These input channels feature coax digital inputs.

If a signal is present on the digital input, it takes precedence over the analog input. There are four additional Digital only input channels featuring both coax and Optical inputs. Any source can be listened to in any zone, simultaneously.

All eight zones may select the same source, in such circumstances there is a possibility that all eight zones may be trying to control that source (not always desirable) so a system should be well planned and where appropriate additional source equipment installed.

Preamplifier Zone Outputs

The preamplifier output zones are completely independent of the digital amplifier zones. These can optionally be used for locations where a high or lower power amplifier / speaker would be required. A third party power amplifier is required to power the zone speakers. Alternatively a preamplifier zone may be zone linked to one of the digital amplifier zones, and provide line level outputs to the zones sub-woofer.

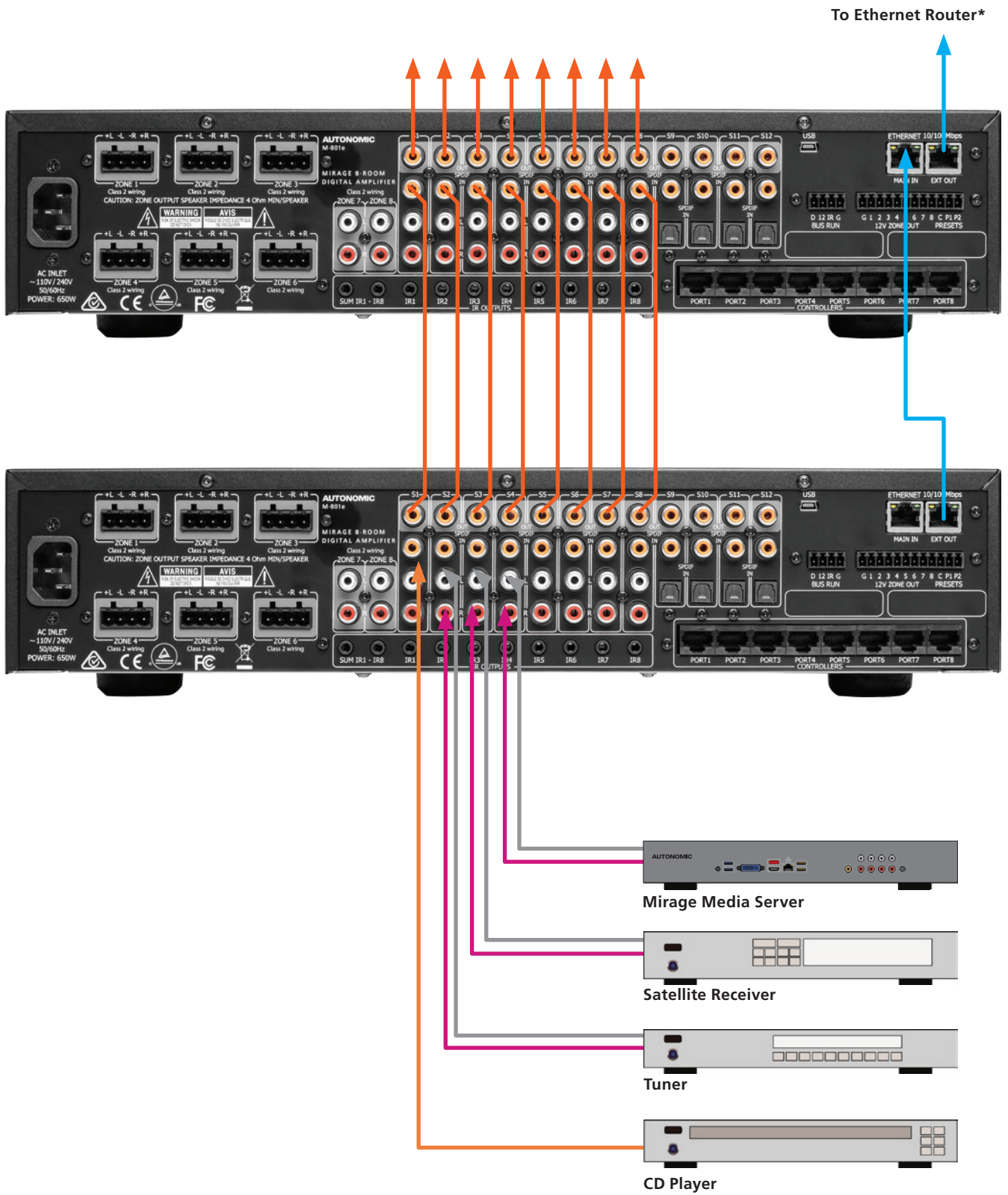
Mirage Media Server

When pairing your M-801e amplifier with a Mirage Media Server, be sure to use the Mirage Media Server's web configuration Sources page and follow the pairing process there. This will ensure full control via the Mirage iOS and Android applications.

Multiple Amplifier (Continued)

In large installations where multiple M-801e amplifiers are required, Ethernet conveys amplifier control, and link to other Media sources if connected to the Home network Router or Switch. Ensure all amplifiers using same the amp ID in the stack.

The source equipment audio inputs must be plugged into the first amplifier where they are buffered and sent to the next amplifier in the stack. The maximum recommended expansion is 24 units.

Fig 2. shows a stack of M-801e with Source connections to first amplifier where they are converted to Digital audio, buffered and sent to the next amplifier in the stack. Use good quality Coax Digital Shielded RCA cables for the interconnection, cables should be no more than 3 meters or 10 feet. The maximum recommended expansion is twelve units.

*This chaining of Ethernet is an option but a direct connection to the router is the best option.

Controller Wiring

The M-801e is packed with control options:

- **USB:**
Used for firmware update.
- **ETHERNET:**
Two 100BaseT connections to a home network or to daisy chain other amplifiers.
- **CONTROLLERS:**
Conveys +12VDC, IR and data between the M-801e and KP-6 keypad controllers, connected using CAT5 cables.
- **BUS RUN:**
For future use.
- **TRIGGERS:**
+12VDC 100mA trigger output when a zone is on.

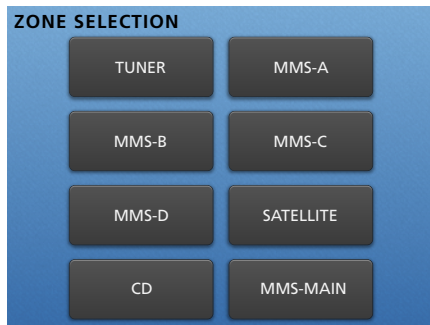

Menu Navigation

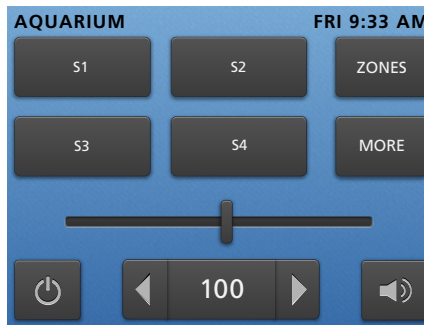
Front Panel User Interface

The M-801e amplifier has a 2.4" Touch Panel LCD color display which is used for control and accessing status of all amplifier functions. After 2 minutes of inactivity the LCD dims to 50% brightness. After a further 15 minutes it dims OFF. A touch of the screen will restore the LCD to full brightness, enabling touch control.



Home Page

The Home page provides access to the Amplifier Zones: Zone1 - Zone 8. In this example, Tuner, MMS-A, MMS-B, MMS-C, MMS-D, Satellite, CD and MMS-Main. Selecting a Zone opens its control page.

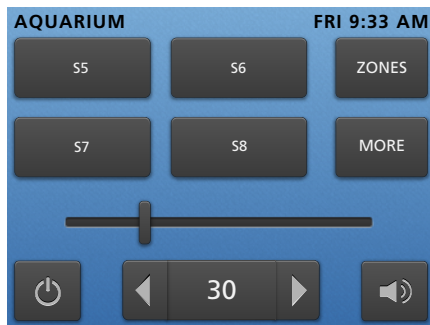


Zone Control Page

The top of the Control page displays the Zone as well as the current time & day. The "Zones" button will return you to the home page. The Zone Control page provides status & control for the selected zones:

- Standby
- Volume Slider
- Volume Up / Down with Digit readout
- Source Selects S1 – S4

- More button S5 - S8
- Mute

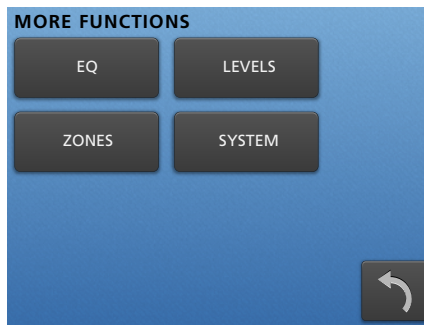


If the button has blue text with a white glow behind the button, it indicates selection or ON status. The Volume Slider changes color as the volume increases, i.e. Green –Yellow – Red.

Zone Control Page (Continued)

Selecting the "More" button will display the next set of sources: S5 – S8. To change the selected source, simply push a Source button.

If the "More" button is selected again the source selection loops back to the start: S1 – S4.



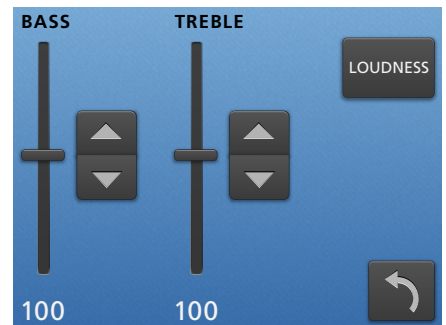
More Functions Page

When the "More" button is pressed and held for more than 1 second, a "More Functions" page opens. There are three Zone specific functions that when selected navigate to setup pages:

- EQ
- Levels
- Zones

There is also a System function which is not zone specific. The System page is covered later.

Note: System functions may be accessed via any of the Zones "More Functions" pages. The Back Arrow button returns to the Zone Control page.



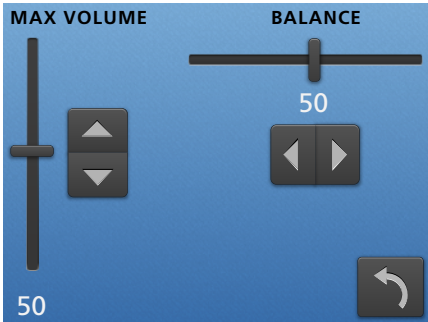
EQ Setup Page

The EQ setup page provides status & control for the selected Zones:

- Bass \pm 12dB using Slider or Up/Down button
- Treble \pm 12dB using Slider or Up/Down Button
- Loudness Control – toggle.

The Back arrow button returns to the "More Functions" page.

Levels Setup Page

The Levels setup page provides status & control for the selected zones:

- Balance $\pm 20\text{dB}$ using slider or Left/Right button
- Maximum Volume Limiting – can be reduced over the range from 100 to the minimum of 2 using the slider or Up/Down button.

The Back arrow button returns to the More Functions page.

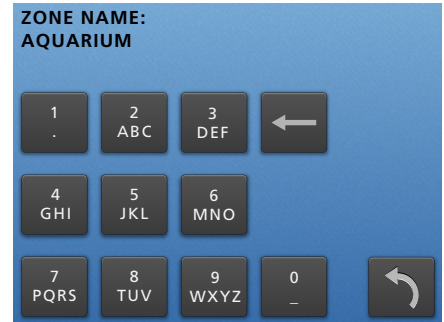


Zones Setup Page

Zones setup page allows you to edit the name and set the Zone coding. There is also a button for zone linking setup. To change the Zone allocation simply make the adjustment using the Up/Down button.

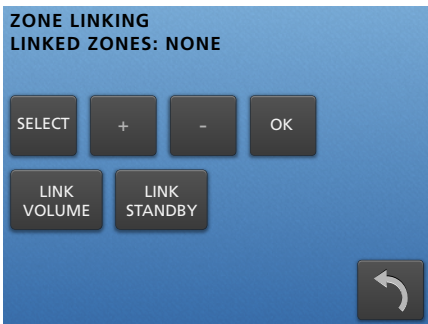
To name the Zone, select "Edit" and the Zone Name page opens.

Zone Name Page

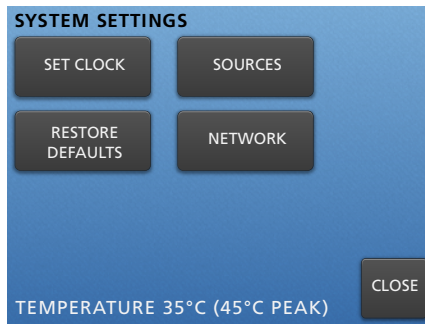
Use the keypad to enter the name text, the limit is 15 regular ASCII characters. Once entered, select the back arrow to return to the Zones Setup page.



Zones Setup Page

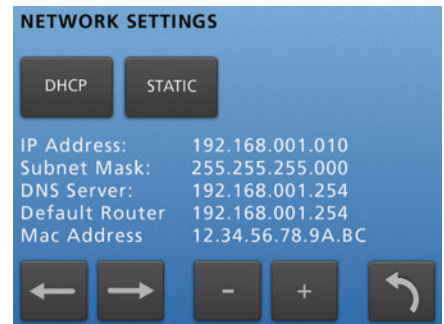

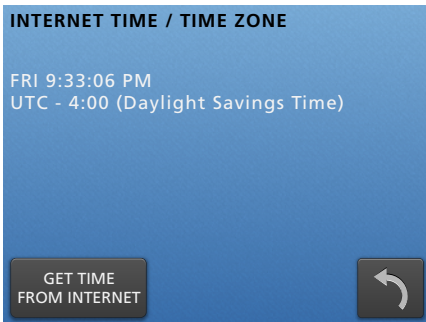

The Zone may be linked with any other zone or zones. Make the selection by scrolling through the zone list and choosing OK. The Type of Zone Linking:

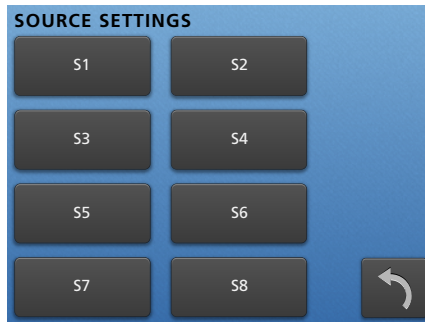

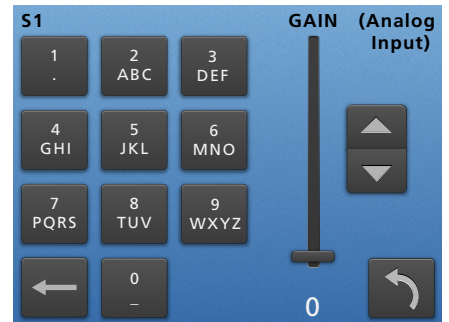

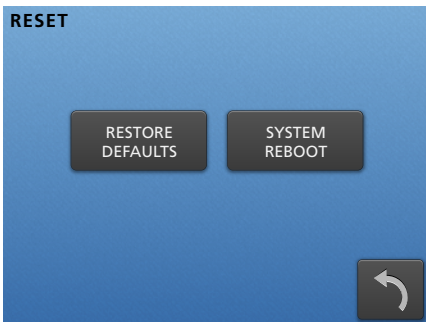
Select the Source to be adjusted, from S1-S8. This opens the Source edit page.

A Source may be named, by using the phone Keypad. The analog input gain can be adjusted using the Gain slider or Up/Down buttons.

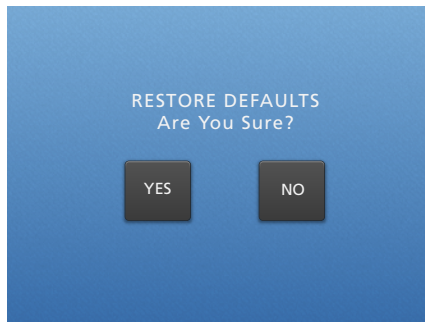


Gain is used to match the analog input levels to the Digital sources. Some Analog sources have large variation in output levels. The 0dB default setting is suitable for connection to high output devices like CD players, while the standard level (1Vrms) is achieved by setting the gain to +6dB. The Gain slider (and source button) will flash red if the gain is set to high and distortion is detected. Select the Back arrow to return to the System Settings Page.



System Reset

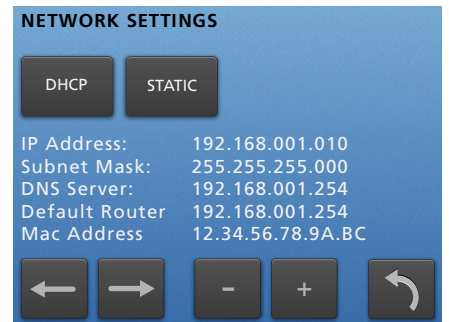
Restore your amplifier to factory defaults or reboot the amplifier.



Restore Defaults Page

To restore the M-801e to factory defaults select "Yes", or to return to previous menu select "No".

Factory defaults will reset the zone allocations back to 1 - 8. It clears all settings like Zone Names, Source Names, Maximum Volume Limits, Bass, Treble and Loudness etc.



Network Settings Page

Network setting always defaults to DHCP. The connected Ethernet router's allocated IP address can be viewed. If for some reason a Static IP is required the selection can be made, and settings adjusted using the back and forward arrow and plus minus keys.

Select the back arrow to return to the System Settings page.

Ethernet Protocol

The Ethernet port provides data acquisition and control of the Mirage amplifiers by a home automation system, or PC Via TCP port 17037.

Zone

Amplifiers are encoded with up to 96 zones.

The zone byte is used for checking if the command is applicable to the device receiving the command and if so, for optionally selecting a "sub-device," e.g. a bank or part of a device. All Zones are addressed using FF.

The lower 5 bits of the zone byte represent the zone 0 – 31.

Selection:

- 00000 bin = 00 (hex) = zone 0
- 00001 bin = 01 (hex) = zone 1
- 01010 bin = 0A (hex) = zone 10
- 11111 bin = 1F (hex) = zone 31

Addressing a zone 10 amplifier: Binary 000-01010 or 0A hex Send ASCII "0A"

Addressing all Zone amp & preamplifier: FF hex Send ASCII "FF"

Notes

- When a command is sent to an amplifier it will first be transmitted on the control bus and then returned to the PC (Home Automation System). If an error occurs an error will be returned instead of the original command. The PC (Home Automation System) needs to ignore its command when it is returned.
- A Standby ON command implies that the amplifier is not muted, if the amplifier was previously Off, a mute command must follow the Standby command if it is muted.
- Not all Command and Data commands are covered in this document.
- The expected reply for the "Send all Parameters" command (09) is >144 bytes. All command fields listed in this document are contained in the reply. The reply also contains advanced commands not listed in this document. The home Automation or PC's buffer should be large enough to receive and process the 144-byte reply.
 - Zone 2 links to Zone 3.
 - Since Zone 2 is no longer linked to Zone 1, Zone 1 will no longer be linked to Zone 2.
 - Since Zone 3 is no longer linked to zone 4, Zone 4 will no longer be linked to Zone 3.

Example strings:

- 010A01: Standby ON command for Zone 10 amplifier.
- 012A01: Standby ON command for Zone 10 preamplifier.
- 060002: +2db Treble setting on Zone 0.
- 031F02: Select Source 7 on Zone 31.
